Readings for Year B, Proper 25

FIRST READING

Jer 31.7–9

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah.

Thus says the Lord: Sing aloud with gladness
for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the
nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, 'Save,
O Lord, your people, the remnant of Israel.'
See, I am going to bring them from the land of
the north, and gather them from the farthest
parts of the earth, among them the blind and
the lame, those with child and those in labour,
together; a great company, they shall return
here. With weeping they shall come, and with
consolations I will lead them back, I will let
them walk by brooks of water, in a straight
path in which they shall not stumble; for I
have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim
is my firstborn.

SECOND READING

Heb 7.23–28

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

The former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but Jesus holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them. For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever.

GOSPEL READING

Mk 10.46–52

The Lord be with you.

Hear the Gospel ✠ of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Mark.

They came to Jericho. And as Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a great crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the roadside. And when he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, ‘Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!’ And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he cried out all the more, ‘Son of David, have mercy on me!’ And Jesus stopped and said, ‘Call him.’ And they called the blind man, saying to him, ‘Take heart. Get up; he is calling you.’ And throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. And Jesus said to him, ‘What do you want me to do for you?’ And the blind man said to him, ‘Rabbi, let me recover my sight.’ And Jesus said to him, ‘Go your way; your faith has made you well.’ And immediately he recovered his sight and followed him on the way.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

A SERMON *follows.*

All *stand* to recite the NICENE CREED.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *(all bow)* was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. *(all rise)* For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life ☩ of the world to come. Amen.

The INTERCESSIONS are introduced, and all kneel. One of these responses may be used:

∇. Lord, hear us. ℞. Lord, graciously hear us.
or ∇. Lord, in your mercy, ℞. Hear our prayer.

At the Commemoration of the Departed:

∇. Rest eternal ☩ grant unto them, O Lord;
℞. And let light perpetual shine upon them.

The Intercessions end:

Accept these prayers, for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

All *stand* as the priest introduces the PEACE.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

OFFERTORY HYMN—154

The people unite their prayers with the priest, who says the PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS.

Look favourably, Lord, upon the gifts we make to you, so that our poor human worship may serve to give you glory; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

All kneel. After the Consecration, all acclaim:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died;

Christ is risen;

Christ will come again.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues, and ends:

... for ever and ever. Amen.

RITE OF COMMUNION

The priest introduces the LORD'S PRAYER.

**Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.**

**For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

The priest breaks the Host; AGNUS DEI is sung.

have mercy on us.**

The priest gives the COMMUNION INVITATION.

Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the

Holy Communion is distributed.

The priest says the POST-COMMUNION prayer.

God of all grace, your Son Jesus Christ fed
the hungry with the bread of his life and the
word of his kingdom: renew your people with
your heavenly grace, and in all our weakness
sustain us by your true and living bread; who
is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen.**

CONCLUSION

The priest gives the BLESSING and DISMISSAL.

you, and remain with you always. **Amen.**
