Dan 7.9–10,13–14

A reading from the book of Daniel.

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and
an Ancient One took his throne; his clothing
was white as snow, and the hair of his head
like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames,
and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of
fire issued and flowed out from his presence.
A thousand thousand served him, and ten

GOSPEL READING

Jn 18.33-37

The Lord be with you.

the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do
you say this of your own accord, or did others
say it to you about me?" Pilate answered, "Am
I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests
have delivered you over to me. What have you
done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is
not of this world. If my kingdom were of this
world, my servants would have been fighting,
that I might not be delivered over to the Jews.
But my kingdom is not from the world." Then
Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus
answered, "You say that I am a king. For this
purpose I was born and for this purpose I
have come into the world – to bear witness to
the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens
to my voice."

All stand to recite the NICENE CREED.

**We believe in one God, the Father, the
Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all
that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the
only Son of God, eternally begotten of the
Father, God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not
made, of one Being with the Father; through**

him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (all bow) was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. (all rise) For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life ✠ of the world to come. Amen.

The INTERCESSIONS are introduced, and all kneel. One of these responses may be used:
V. Lord, hear us. R. Lord, graciously hear us.
or V. Lord, in your mercy, R. Hear our prayer.

At the Commemoration of the Departed:
V. Rest eternal ✠ grant unto them, O Lord;
R. And let light perpetual shine upon them.

The Intercessions end:
Merciful Father,
Accept these prayers, for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

All stand as the priest introduces the PEACE.
The peace of the Lord be always with you.
And also with you.

The people unite their prayers with the priest, who says the PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS.

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Church.

We offer you, Lord, the sacrifice which reconciles mankind, and ask that your Son may grant to all nations the gifts of unity and peace; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The PREFACE follows.

All respond with the SANCTUS & BENEDICTUS.
Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he ✠ who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

All kneel. After the Consecration, all acclaim:
Great is the mystery of faith:
Christ has died;
Christ is risen;
Christ will come again.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues, and ends:
... for ever and ever. Amen.

RITE OF COMMUNION

The priest introduces the LORD'S PRAYER.

**Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.**

**For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

The priest breaks the Host; AGNUS DEI is sung.

**Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the
world: have mercy on us.
Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the
world: have mercy on us.

world: grant us peace.**

The priest gives the COMMUNION INVITATION.

Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the
sin of the world. Blessed are those who are
called to his supper.
**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but
only say the word, and I shall be healed.**

Holy Communion is distributed.

The priest says the POST-COMMUNION prayer.

Stir up, O Lord, the wills of your faithful
people; that they, plenteously bringing forth
the fruit of good works, may by you be
plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ
our Lord. **Amen.**

CONCLUSION

The priest gives the BLESSING and DISMISSAL.

The Lord be with you.
And also with you.

Bow your heads and pray for God's blessing.

God the Father, who has given to his Son the
name above every name, strengthen you to
proclaim Christ Jesus as Lord. **Amen.**

God the Son, who is our great high priest
passed into the heavens, plead for you at
the right hand of the Father. **Amen.**

God the Holy Spirit, who pours out his
abundant gifts upon the Church, make you
faithful servants of Christ the King. **Amen.**

And the blessing of God almighty, the Father,
the Son, ✠ and the Holy Spirit, be among
you, and remain with you always. **Amen.**
