FIRST READING

*Isa 40.1–11*

A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.  
Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that  
she has served her term, that her penalty is  
paid, that she has received from the Lord's hand  
double for all her sins. A voice cries out: 'In the  
wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make  
straight in the desert a highway for our God.  
Every valley shall be lifted up, and every moun-  
tain and hill be made low; the uneven ground  
shall become level, and the rough places a plain.  
Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and  
all people shall see it together, for the mouth of  
the Lord has spoken.' A voice says, 'Cry out!'  
And I said, 'What shall I cry?' All people are  
grass, their constancy is like the flower of the  
field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when  
the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the  
people are grass. The grass withers, the flower  
fades; but the word of our God will stand for  
ever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion,  
herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with  
strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings,

2 Pet 3.8–15

A reading from the second letter of Peter.

Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed. Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home. Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation.

GOSPEL READING

Mk 1.1–8

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**  
Hear the Gospel ✠ of our Lord Jesus Christ

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ,

As it is written in Isaiah the prophet, “Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way, the voice of one crying in the wilderness: ‘Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight;’” John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

Now John was clothed with camel’s hair and wore a leather belt round his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. And he preached, saying, “After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.”

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the**

only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, *(all bow)* was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. *(all rise)* For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life ✠ of the world to come. Amen.

*The INTERCESSIONS are introduced, and all kneel. One of these responses may be used:*

or ∇. Lord, in your mercy, ℞. **Hear our prayer.**

*At the Commemoration of the Departed:*

∇. Rest eternal ✠ grant unto them, O Lord;  
℞. **And let light perpetual shine upon them.**

*The Intercessions end:*

Merciful Father,  
Accept these prayers, for the sake of your  
Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

*All stand as the priest introduces the PEACE.*

**May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Church.**

Lord, we are nothing without you. As you sustain us with your mercy, receive our prayers and offerings. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

### EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**  
Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**  
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

*The PREFACE follows.*

*All respond with the SANCTUS & BENEDICTUS.*  
**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.**  
**Blessed is he ✠ who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

*All kneel. After the Consecration, all acclaim:*  
Christ is the bread of life:  
**When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory (× 2).**

*The Eucharistic Prayer continues, and ends:*  
... for ever and ever. Amen.

## RITE OF COMMUNION

*The priest introduces the LORD'S PRAYER.*

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.**

**For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

*The priest breaks the Host; AGNUS DEI is sung.*
